

Publication Opportunities for Accepted Abstracts

Abstracts accepted for presentation at the Congress may, at the discretion of the authors, be considered for publication as **abstracts, full papers, or journal articles**.

Full Paper Submission

Authors whose contributions are presented at the Congress may, if they wish, submit a full paper prepared in accordance with the manuscript preparation guidelines to be announced by the Congress Organizing Committee. Full papers that successfully complete the scientific evaluation process may be published in the **Congress Proceedings Book**.

Eligibility for full paper submission is **not restricted to oral presentations**. Contributions accepted and presented as **poster presentations** are equally eligible for submission as full papers. Accordingly, full papers prepared from poster presentations may also be considered for publication in the Congress Proceedings Book.

Furthermore, studies initially submitted as oral presentations but subsequently accepted as poster presentations following the evaluation of the Scientific Committee may also be submitted as full papers, provided that they have been presented at the Congress.

Publication of a full paper in the Congress Proceedings Book is contingent upon compliance with the prescribed formatting requirements and successful completion of the scientific review process.

Journal Publication Process

Among the studies presented at the Congress, suitable manuscripts may, upon the request of the authors and in accordance with the editorial policies of the relevant journals, be considered for publication as full-length research articles.

Eligibility for journal consideration is **not limited to oral presentations**. Studies presented as poster presentations may likewise be considered for journal publication, provided that they satisfy the scientific standards, originality requirements, and manuscript criteria of the target journal.

However, manuscripts submitted to journals are expected **not to be identical to the conference paper**. Rather, they should constitute substantially expanded and revised versions prepared in accordance with the standards of a scientific journal article, including comprehensive **Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, and Conclusion** sections.

The evaluation of manuscripts submitted to journals will be conducted entirely in accordance with the editorial screening and peer-review procedures of the respective journals.

Detailed information regarding submission deadlines, manuscript templates, formatting instructions, submission procedures, and evaluation criteria for both the full paper and journal publication processes will be announced separately on the Congress website. Authors are responsible for ensuring that their submissions comply with the published guidelines and templates.

Application for Journal Evaluation

Authors wishing to have their presented work considered for publication as a journal article should submit the **conference abstract** via e-mail to:

The e-mail should clearly include the following information:

- Title of the contribution
- Full names of all authors
- Confirmation that the contribution has been accepted and presented at the Congress
- The name of the journal for which the manuscript is intended to be considered

Journals Planned for Manuscript Evaluation

Appropriately expanded manuscripts derived from contributions presented at the Congress are planned to be considered for publication, subject to the aims, scope, and editorial policies of the respective journals, including:

- Acta Alimentaria
- International Journal of Medicinal Mushrooms
- Mycopath
- Eurasian Journal of Medical and Biological Sciences
- International Journal of Chemistry and Technology
- The Journal of Fungus

*Please note that referral of a manuscript to a journal **does not constitute or guarantee acceptance for publication**. Final acceptance is solely dependent upon the journal's editorial assessment, peer-review process, compliance with its aims and scope, and adherence to its author guidelines. Any recommendation made by the Congress Organizing Committee should therefore be regarded as an opportunity for consideration rather than a commitment to publication.*
